The distribution of jobs indicates that 85% or higher of completers enter the teaching field. Some enter graduate studies in related fields such as special education, speech pathology, or school counseling. Others choose to stay at home with families and young children.

These data are self-reported by completers. The primary reason that completers leave the profession is to be full-time caretakers of young children at home. These data indicate that NGU completers continue in teaching. The NGU College of Education's integration of the belief that teaching is a ministry calling rather than just a profession may contribute to this high percentage remaining in teaching.
